### a letter from the president Dear Friends of WSAS,

As December arrives, the days at Wellesley grow shorter and the nights longer. Yet, amidst the darkness, the Wellesley Students' Aid Society shines

brightly, offering hope and support to the College and its students.

While much of Wellesley Students' Aid Society's support, both in the past and now, provides essential loans and grants for tuition, our mission has expanded to address a broader range of needs for low-income students. Wellesley Students' Aid Society continues to offer emergency grants and loans, stepping in during critical moments-whether it's an unexpected trip home to visit an ill parent, dental work not covered by insurance, or urgent repairs to a laptop. But our reach doesn't stop there. We now provide student service grants to various College departments and offices, supporting everything from graduate school preparation to physical education gear, and even professional development opportunities. These important grants, totaling \$77,000 this past year, have made a tangible impact on student life, allowing them to seize opportunities they might otherwise miss.

Another cherished tradition, the Clothes Closet, continues to provide students with clothing for interviews and everyday wear. But now, Wellesley Students' Aid Society has taken this a step further with our Residential Resource Closet. Stocked with essentials like shampoo, deodorant, and laundry detergent, this closet offers everyday items that many of us take for granted but can be out of reach for lowincome students. Additionally, Wellesley Students' Aid Society offers a winter clothing grant, ensuring that once during their time at Wellesley, students can receive a brand-new winter coat. For some, it's the first new coat they've ever owned—an experience that is both heartwarming and transformative.



# 2023–2024 Impact

Supporting today's Wellesley students in their educational pursuits is about more than just guidance—it's about shaping the change-makers of tomorrow. By giving them the resources, mentorship, and inspiration they need, we empower them to break barriers, innovate, and make their mark on the world. These students will be the visionaries, the trailblazers, and the thought leaders driving positive change in society.

Thanks to your generous support, in 2023–2024, WSAS was able to provide:



\* Gifts include funding for medical and other emergencies, support for all students on financial aid (including gift cards for textbooks), and necessities such as winter clothes and linens.

In 2023–2024, WSAS pledged nearly \$1.4 million in tuition aid, along with \$210,000 in gift cards for textbooks and other learning materials. We also supported opportunities like internships, fellowships, and study abroad.

For the 2024–2025 academic year, WSAS has committed \$600,000 in tuition loans and \$760,00 in tuition grants to the college. This pledge is in addition to of thousands of dollars in emergency funding, nointerest loans, student services grants, and essential resources for students.

### STUDENT SERVICES GRANTS PROGRAM

The Wellesley Students' Aid Society (WSAS) has continued its Student Services Grants program for its 5th year, collaborating with Wellesley College departments to address student needs.

As of May 2024, WSAS awarded 63 grants totaling \$360,150. These grants support various student services, from professional development to financial assistance, with a focus on aiding students with financial need.

#### SPECIFIC GRANTS INCLUDE:

**Wellesley Career Education:** \$10,000 for graduate school preparation, offering \$100 awards to help cover application-related costs.

**Health Professions Advising:** \$2,000 for a cohort supporting underrepresented students in medicine, including transportation funding for program activities.

**LGBTO+ Programs:** \$8,000 for gender-affirming gear, benefiting transgender, nonbinary, and gender non-conforming students.

**Office of Intercultural Education:** \$5,000 for professional development grants, supporting conferences and credentials for underrepresented students.

**Office of International Study:** \$10,000 for study abroad expenses, including passports and visas, for high-need students.

**Office of Student Success:** \$10,000 for summer storage fee waivers for first-generation, low-income students.

**Phi Beta Kappa:** \$3,500 to cover membership dues for students on financial aid.

**PERA Physical Education:** \$10,000 for PE gear for students with financial need and \$1,000 for Outdoor Adventure Access for low-income students.

**Slater International Center:** \$4,500 for U.S. work authorization fees for international students and \$3,000 for food accessibility during academic breaks.

Stone Center Counseling Service: \$10,000 to help reduce financial barriers to mental health services.

## Launching the Leaders of Tomorrow

The Wellesley Students' Aid Society was founded within Wellesley College and incorporated in 1916 "for the purpose of securing, holding and dispersing funds to be loaned or given to students of Wellesley College whose personal means are insufficient for their support in college" (WSAS articles of incorporation).

WSAS is known for providing tuition assistance, but we also set aside hundreds of thousands of dollars a year to help students with other crucial expenses, giving them the freedom to focus on their studies. Here are just a few areas where WSAS gifts and no-interest loans have made a vital difference:

- Tuition aid and much more
- Funds to cover unexpected medical expenses
- Airfare for students facing a family illness or other crisis
- Professional attire for job interviews
- Senior gift of \$150 to each student graduating who is on financial aid
- Warm clothing and boots for cold winters
- Gift cards for textbooks

## WSAS: A constant source of unwavering support for students

"Because of the support from the WSAS, many of my necessities, like winter clothing, toiletries, etc. were supplied by this team, which is a privilege that is not available at most other schools. However, the most meaningful aid I received from the Students' Aid Society occurred this past Fall. In September, I flew home due to a family emergency. When I came back to campus, I returned as an orphan, with no guardians who could support me financially during my final year at Wellesley. Whilst trying to stay on top of my coursework, I discovered that my laptop was no longer functioning. After getting it checked out, I was told that it could not be fixed, and I needed to buy a new one. At this point, I was extremely overwhelmed. My sister was over 500 miles away, and we were navigating medical bills, funeral planning, and our finances on our own for the first time. On a whim, I called the Wellesley Students' Aid Society, and found myself on the line with Kat. She assured me that I could apply for a grant. Within a couple of days, my request was approved, and I found myself with a brand new laptop at no cost. I was able to finish out my last semesters at Wellesley feeling supported, despite the tremendous loss I had just experienced."

## tanya Roy '81: 20 Years of Visionary Leadership



The Wellesley Students' Aid Society (WSAS) has been guided by the dedication of many strong and passionate board members, all united by a shared vision: to help the next generation achieve greater success with fewer financial burdens in their pursuit of education. This vision is embodied in WSAS's long-standing mission to "secure, hold, and distribute funds to be loaned or given to Wellesley College students whose personal resources are insufficient to support their college education."

While this mission drives the entire organization, the responsibility of "securing, holding, and dispersing funds" was particularly central to Tanya Roy, class of '81, during her tenure. She began her service as Director in 2004 and served as Treasurer from 2006 to 2024.

### A Personal Journey Meets Professional Leadership

As an alumna, Tanya's connection to WSAS is deeply personal. While a student, she recognized the vital role the WSAS played in supporting her friends and classmates. Although much has changed over the years, the fundamental needs of students remain. Tanya still reflects on the limitations of school-sponsored aid, noting how it often falls short in addressing the real needs of students gaps that the WSAS works to fill.

Tanya lights up when discussing the progress made over the last 20 years.

"The depth and breadth of our aid have truly expanded," she says. "We've introduced a new department grant program that has been incredibly successful and popular. We've also expanded our gift card program to include all four classes of students. Our clothes closet has been a resource for many years, and more recently, we've established a resource closet stocked with basic hygiene items for women—essentials that can be quite costly for students."

Tanya emphasizes that the WSAS's ability to meet students' needs is due to the dedication and talent of its staff, the commitment of the board of directors, and the unwavering generosity of its loyal donors.

### A Community Effort: Driven by Loyalty and Generosity

"Our mission remains the same, but our scope has broadened," Tanya explains. "We've been able to expand our aid to students thanks to our loyal and dedicated alumni, along with their friends and family, who contribute year after year. Many alumni have even included us in their estate planning. These contributions are vital for supporting our operations and growing our endowment."

Tanya has skillfully guided the Students' Aid Society through a period of economic growth, ensuring that donations are thoughtfully cultivated for the benefit of recipients. Whether students need a winter coat, a swimsuit, hygiene products, or the empowerment to meet their needs through gift cards or loans, the Wellesley Students' Aid Society is dedicated to fulfilling their basic needs. 
### A Legacy That Lives On

The Wellesley Students' Aid Society applies the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The Board of Directors has designated as unrestricted scholarship funds all permanent funds donated to the Society without restriction on the use of income earned on investment of the principal fund balance. The income earned thereon is available to unrestricted general funds to assist in funding the operations of the Society.

A provision is made for doubtful loans when they are determined to be uncollectible.

The Society has committed \$1,360,000 for financial aid to students at Wellesley College during the academic year 2024–2025. Of this amount, \$760,000 will be given in the form of scholarships and \$600,000 as student loans repayable to the Society.

The above statement of assets, liabilities, and net assets as of June 30, 2024, has been derived from the Wellesley Students' Aid Society, Inc.'s audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2024.
